

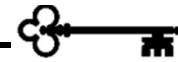

Sikhi	The Sikh religion was founded in Northern India in the fifteenth century by Guru Nanak Dev Ji	Waheguru	Almighty God, the creator, supreme soul
Sikh	Disciple or learner	Khalsa	Community of believers
Gurdwara	Place of worship	Vand Chhakna	Everyone sharing earnings and resources e.g. food, time and effort in serving others.
Kirat Karni	Everyone earning by means of hard work and honest effort.	Naam Japna	Everyone remembering the name of God at all times whether working, distributing food or cleaning.
Guru	Divine spiritual messengers	Amrit	Nectar- made from water and sugar, used in the baptism ceremony by Sikhs
Guru Granth Sahib	Living Guru and Holy Text	Ik Onkar symbol	There is only one God

- Sikhs believe that there is only one God, who they have several names for. (Waheguru)
- Sikhs try to put the teachings and examples of the 10 gurus into daily practice by living a good life, treating everyone equally and sharing all they have.
- It is important for Sikh's to belong to a community of believers called the Khalsa.
- Khalsa Sikhs wear 5 articles of faith which reminds them of their faith and duty as a Sikh.
