Key Vocabulary

Neighbour	Anyone in our world.	Parable	A lesson which is a short story used by Jesus to teach people.
Disciple	Someone who believes in Jesus and seeks to follow him in his or her daily life.	Hidden Meaning	A meaning hidden inside a story. You will need to use inference and deduction to work out the meaning.
Clergy	Official leaders of the religious activities of a particular group of believers.	Love	The nature of God.
Teachings	Lessons taught to people by Jesus and recorded in the Bible.	Hypocrisy	Insincere worship.
Social Justice	Fair and just relations between the people and society as measured by the distribution of wealth, opportunities for personal activity, and social privileges.		



Key Learning

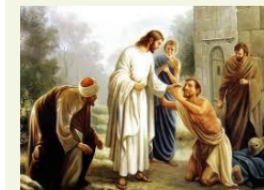
- Christians believe Jesus challenges everyone about how to live — he sets the example for loving God and your neighbour, putting others first.
