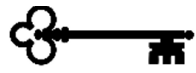

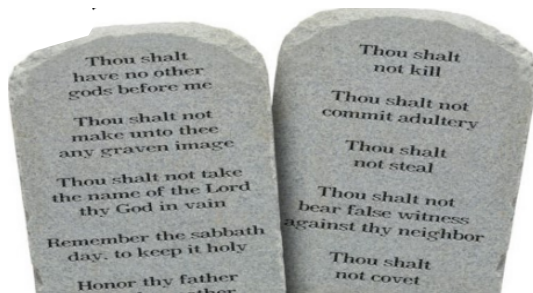

Key Learning

- Jesus was Jewish.
- Christians believe Jesus is God in the flesh.
- They believe that his birth, life, death and resurrection were part of a longer plan by God to restore the relationship between humans and God.
- The Old Testament talks about a 'rescuer' or 'anointed one' – a messiah. Some texts talk about what this 'messiah' would be like.
- Christians believe that Jesus fulfilled these expectations, and that he is the Messiah. (Jewish people do not think Jesus is the Messiah.)

Key Vocabulary

Freedom	A gift given by God when He takes away guilt and the trapping power of sinful behaviour.
Justice	The protection of what is fair, just, and right.
Theological	The study and explanation of religious faith, practice, and experience.
Exodus	When God led His people (Israelite) from slavery in Egypt to the promise Land.
Slavery	People owning other people.
Obedience	Christians believe that it is to do what the Lord asks out of reverence and love for the Lord, not because they are living in fear of punishment.
Salvation	God's gift of rescue from sin and death to humans.
Commandments	10 rules/laws given by God to humans to live by.
Covenant	A promise between people and God.
Injustice	Absence of justice, a violation of right or of the rights of another person. An act, which is unfair. An act, which is wrong.
Mission	A task that is regarded as a very important duty
